### **Director's Report**

We are pleased to present our 2022 Annual Report for the Economic Development Corporation (EDC). It has been a challenging year for us and for the Economy, with rising costs and shipping delays, however we are once again pleased that new opportunities were brought to our community. We also want to welcome Andrew Rubinstein to our board as a city liaison. We look forward to working with Andrew.

Detroit Die has been a part of our community for many years, and we are pleased to report that they are our newest partner in our Industrial Incubator on Easterday Avenue. This move allows them to bid on



additional projects and expand their workforce. Their sizeable investment in this transition is appreciated, and we look forward to assisting them in their growth.

One of our goals each year is to identify and promote any vacant building and properties in the city. One of the tools available to us is the Zoom Prospector program through the State. This service allows us to include them in a state-wide search program. We have done this for several sites, and we appreciate the state for this valuable service.

We are happy to report that the JETA Corporation has purchased a parcel in our air industrial park. This allows them to expand their business into Michigan, and more than happy that they chose the Soo. JETA is a supplier of many industrial products and will work hand-in-hand with large corporations across the Nation. Welcome Linda and your staff! The building process is scheduled to start in late 2023. We are very happy to welcome U-Haul Company to our community. They have purchased the former K-Mart property, and they have made a sizeable investment in our community including property improvements and hiring staff. We wish them all the best.

Another vacant building was Main Filter on Meridian Street. After many showings, we were able to connect the owner with a new tenant, Red Bull beverages. We look forward to assisting them in any way we can.

Our Brownfield program continues to be a very desirable program for clean-up and development of properties. Our two projects, LSSU CFRE and the MAC Building are wrapping up and near completion. We were successful with obtaining \$2 Million dollars in grant funding for these projects, which has and will lead to increased employment and cleaning up our environment. We have been told that without the Brownfield program the project would not have been possible. We look forward to the growth of the CFRE and the housing & retail space provided by the MAC project. I am confident that 2023 will see additional Brownfield projects.

We continue to work with our area businesses, including our manufacturing community. A message that we consistently hear is that they cannot find staff to fill vacant positions. If you know someone that is looking for employment (engineering, accounting & more) please contact our office as we may be able to assist you.

The Soo Locks project is progressing as scheduled. We are pleased to have partnered with the general contractor, and we meet with them regularly. They are gearing up for the 2023 construction season and will be looking for skilled labor positions. Please contact us if you or someone you know is interested in a career.





## 2022 Highlights

With the COVID-19 Pandemic coming to and end with businesses and gatherings allowable we are able to host more events and engage the community again!

#### **January:**

Assisted in the planning of the temporary housing project that will hopefully be taking place in 2023 for the Locks & Enbridge projects.

### May:

We held a hospitality and customer service workshop in collaboration with Superior Hospitality Partners.

### **September:**

We assisted Detroit Die Cutting/ OMNI in expanding to the Industrial Incubator, as they grown in sales they look to hire more employees.

#### **February:**

We hosted three Business Career Tech classes from Sault High School to talk about the EDC and starting a business, teaming up with the SBDC.

#### **June:**

We sent out the U of M E-Cities survey to local business owners to receive a metrics of Sault Ste. Marie compared to other Michigan cities

#### October:

We assisted and helped with the EUPISD Manufacturing Day in which seven area manufactures were able to educate the students on manufacturing.

### March:

We sent out 25 US Coast Guard Welcome Binders as well as created a virtual binder for information prior to moving.

### July:

We worked with the MEDC, EGLE and the State Land Bank to host a Property Redevelopment Workshop.

### **November:**

Presented to new Coast Guard members on the EDC services and welcomed them.

#### **April:**

We teamed up with the UP Construction Council to host a Union Hiring/ Job Fair with 60+ applicants and 250+ High school students.

### August:

We toured the MAC Building with the Brownfield project coming to an end, blueprints show commercial offices/space, and nine apartments.

#### **December:**

Applied for and received the Rural Child Care Innovation Program which will allow us to prove the need for more childcare.

Ideas Production LLC and Omni Metal Craft are engineering firms that serves a parent manufacturing firm in Alpena, MI. They are also material handling and a custom metal fabrication manufacturer. In 2018, they expanded their Engineering and Project Management resources to the Sault Ste. Marie area. They chose to come to the SmartZone so they could work with engineering students at LSSU and Ontario partners. The SmartZone office currently has 5 employees, four of them are LSSU Part-Time interns.

SIS Manufacturing: The Sault SmartZone is home to the company's U.S.-based corporation. Future plans are to increase U.S. operations and manufacturing. They currently have 1 full-time employee.

The Sault Ste. Marie EDC guides individuals through the process of establishing their business. Our SmartZone incubator, located on Meridian Street, provides start-ups with the opportunity to rent office space for the growing business. The mission of the SmartZone is to provide high-quality and economical product development services for entrepreneurs and businesses throughout the region by providing access to current manufacturing facilities, business training programs, and skilled industry personnel.



In September, Detroit Die Cutting rented out 20,000 sq. ft. and office space of our industrial incubator. They are looking to expand their operation and hire new employees.


### **News & Radio**

The resident CFI (Certified Flight Instructor) cannot unfortunately fly anymore due to medical issues. Therefore, he only conducted 1 Training flight this past year. Sanderson Field is looking for someone to assist in continuing this program.


Nearly recovered from the COVID numbers by the summer of 2022. There were some travel restrictions existent in Canada which dropped Oshkosh numbers somewhat, but we anticipate that too will be back to normal this year.

Planned the upcoming Cessna 170 association fly in summer 2023.

Attended the MDOT airport conference in September 2022 on Mackinac Island, and will be attending this year's (SEP 2023) in Muskegon. Also attended the MAAE Conference in Lansing (FEB 2022).

Completed a compliance analysis and were going to present it to MDOT at the MAAE conference. When it was canceled it was decided to complete an updated Airport Layout Plan and include it with the compliance analysis, then set up a meeting with MDOT where we would have all the requirements met that they had outlined in the October meeting.

Had two CTE students. One has completed the 21-22 school year and another has completed all the classroom maintenance training, and we have been going over pilot ground school with him, as well as continuing with the hands on work this school year.

Received many Letters of Support from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Border Patrol, the U.S. Coast Guard, and many other state agencies as well as from MyMichigan Health as a result from an average of 5-6 medivacs monthly. With the support from city council, Sanderson Field began presenting the case to NPIAS to be considered for membership. We continue to market the Air Industrial lots with two being sold last year, and much interest in a few others.



### Website

SandersonField.com saw 2,816 site sessions for an increase of 16% and had 2,483 unique visitors, up 10%. # 2023 IN SAULT STE MARIE

2023 will see the City running the day-to-day operations of the SmartZone. This transition will allow the staff of the EDC to focus on business expansion and attraction.

The EDC Board of Directors and the City Commissioners approved the RFP of Explorer Solutions to complete a city wide Economic Development Strategic Plan. The community and youth will have the opportunity to take part in this initiative.

Some challenges to our area, state and national economy include increased product costs, labor shortages and rising interest rates. Our community will need to work together more than ever to strengthen our cities economy.

The EDC will see some financial challenges. We are always looking alternative funding for our operations.

The EDC has created a Economic Resource Alliance Core Group with the Downtown Development Authority, Chamber of Commerce, Conventions and Visitors Bureau, EUP Regional Planning, and Chippewa County EDC to establish five prominent buildings in the Sault Area to market to developers. We are looking forward to hosting events within this group such as open houses and land development summits.

Due to attracting many businesses in our area, we are looking to identify available business space for start-ups and business expansions.

We are planning to re-establish our Manufacturing Alliance Group to re-connect and identify needs. Having these meetings will allow us to assist them in any way we can, including but not limited to, financing, staffing and marketing.

We have applied for an received a Rural Childcare Innovation Program which will allow us to connect providers, employers, and parents as well as create statistics to send to state legislators to prove the extravagant need in our area.

Identifying needs of our labor and housing shortage via participating in the UP wide labor and housing studies and following the 2021 Housing study and working with developers to identify the stated needs through our community.
